## **RESOLUTION NO. 25-20**

## A RESOLUTION OF THE GREENWOOD COMMON COUNCIL AUTHORIZING THE FILING, ACCEPTANCE AND IMPLEMENTATION OF BROWNFIELD ASSESSMENT GRANT WITH THE U.S. ENVIRONMENTAL PROTECTION AGENCY

WHEREAS, the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) administers a grant program that provides funds to communities for the assessment of environmentally contaminated properties and to conduct cleanup planning of the properties (hereafter "Brownfields") so they may be expanded, developed, or reused, commonly known as a Brownfield Assessment Grant;

WHEREAS, the City of Greenwood ("City") determined that it should be proactive in the restoration of environmentally impaired sites to productive and beneficial use and applied for an EPA Brownfield Assessment Grant ("Grant") in late 2024;

WHEREAS, the City has been notified by the EPA that it has been approved to receive Five Hundred Thousand and No/100 Dollars (\$500,000.00) in Grant funds for federal budget period October 1, 2025 to September 30, 2029;

WHEREAS, as the expenditure of the Grant funding will require appropriation by the City fiscal body over a multi-year period, the City deems it advisable to ratify the application and authorize the acceptance and implementation of the Brownfield Assessment Grant Program for the four-year Grant period;

WHEREAS, it is required and necessary that the City enter into various agreements that are necessary and convenient for the receipt, implementation and administration of said Grant funds,

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE GREENWOOD COMMON COUNCIL AS FOLLOWS:

- Section 1. The City of Greenwood, Indiana hereby authorizes the acceptance and implementation of an EPA Brownfield Assessment Grant to fund environmental assessment and cleanup planning activities at Brownfield sites in the City of Greenwood.
- Section 2. Mark W. Myers, Mayor of the City of Greenwood, Indiana, Greg Wright, City Controller, Gabriel Nelson, Planning Director, City of Greenwood Department of Community Development Services, and Kevin Stienmetz, Capital Projects Manager, be and they are hereby empowered and authorized to act and execute on behalf of the City, any and all convenient or necessary contracts, agreements, and documents required in the obtaining the expenditure, and the administration of said Grant funds for the next four (4) years.
- Section 3. All actions heretofore taken in the filing of the EPA Brownfield Grant application are hereby ratified.
- Section 4. The sections, paragraphs, sentences, clauses, phrases, and words of this Resolution are separable, and if any word, phrase, clause, sentence, paragraph or section of this Resolution shall be declared unconstitutional, invalid or unenforceable by the valid judgment or decree of a court of competent jurisdiction, such unconstitutionality, invalidity or unenforceability shall not affect any of the remaining words, phrases, clauses, sentences, paragraphs and sections of this Resolution.
- Section 5. The Resolution shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage and approval by the Mayor of the City of Greenwood, Indiana.
