New Business

Waterside Commercial Common Area - Wessler Engineering

Mr. Jones familiarized the board with the area that had formerly been Project Rudolph located at the end of McColgin Rd. He suggested doing pond improvements to benefit the future development. Wessler has provided a quote for inspection and advertising.

The board had discussion.

Mr. Sutton moved to approve inspection and advertising services with Wessler Engineering in a lump sum amount not to exceed \$2,900.00 with terms and conditions to be outlined by the legal department and authorize the Stormwater Superintendent to sign on the board's behalf. Mr. Payne seconded. Ayes. **MOTION CARRIES.**

Common Area Survey - Main Street Consulting

Mr. Jones referenced the Waterside Commercial Common Area's detention retention area. The city has purchased this land for redevelopment and will be the common area for the entire commercial subdivision. He states that he has reached out to several land surveying and engineering firms to gather quotes.

Mr. Sutton moved to approve surveying services with Main Street Consulting in an amount not to exceed \$2,800.00 with terms and conditions to be outlined by the legal department and authorize the Stormwater Superintendent to sign on the board's behalf. Mr. Payne seconded. Ayes. **MOTION CARRIES.**

Hunting Creek (Hunters Lane/Doe Lane) Sink Holes

Mr. Jones explained the issues with the sinkholes in the rear yard easement of these properties. The Stormwater Department has sent a letter informing the residents that they need to move all obstructions out of the easement. Mr. Jones has been provided a quote to do joint sealing on the pipe rather than the whole replacement. He will wait to see responses from homeowners.

The board had a discussion. This is not requiring a motion at this time.

The July precipitation total was 4.67 inches and the average temperature was 75.6 degrees. There were 17.56 tons of debris collected from street sweeping totaling \$796.54. The Stormwater Department completed 2562 line locates, 27 requests initiated and 23 completed, 137 work orders initiated and 143 completed for July 2021. There were 27 Erosion and Sediment Control permits issued, and 96 inspections. There was 2 Stormwater Management Permits and 1 inspections completed. 38 BMP Inspections. 17 hot spots cleared. This month's education event was a Pleasant Creek clean up, JCRD Tour of the Nature Center, and a native plant presentation by the Nature Conservancy. Storm line jetting was done in on Padana Dr., Crescent Dr., and Freemont Ln.
