Nature Center Improvements - Secure Links Fence

Mr. Jones informed the board that he found a local company offering services for significantly less than the previous quote.

Mr. Sutton moved to approve a contract with Secure Links Fence Company for fence and gate instillation services in an amount not to exceed \$16,810.00 with terms and conditions to be outlined by the legal department and authorize the Stormwater Superintendent to sign on the Board's behalf. Nature Center Improvements - Monster Cote

Mr. Jones explained that the due to cost savings in other areas, he recommends the instillation of metallic epoxy flooring in the classroom of the Nature Center.

Code § 5-22-10-5; to authorize the lease-purchase of the street sweeper in an amount not to exceed \$295,000 from Brown Equipment Company through the City's Master Lease Agreement with Huntington Public Capital Corporation; and to authorize the Mayor and the Fleet Maintenance Superintendent to sign any and all documents to effectuate the purchase, with final terms and conditions for the purchase to be determined by the Legal Department and to authorize trading in the current street sweeper as part of the purchase, the 2016 Egin Freightliner M2 Model Whirlwind.
