## ORDINANCE NO. 23-04

## AN ORDINANCE AMENDING THE GREENWOOD FIRE DEPARTMENT MERIT SYSTEM TO PROHIBIT COMMISSIONER EX PARTE COMMUNICATION CONCERNING DISCIPLINARY MATTERS

WHEREAS, the Common Council of the City of Greenwood ("Common Council") repealed and re-established a merit system for the Greenwood Fire Department in accordance with Ind. Code § 36-8-3.5-3 by Common Council Ordinance No. 20-26, as amended;

WHEREAS, Ind. Code § 36-8-3.5-1(f) authorizes the Common Council to amend the adopted merit system;

WHEREAS, it has been determined that the Fire Department Merit System should be further amended to prohibit commission members from participating in ex parte communications concerning any pending disciplinary matter, other matters about which charges are expected, or summary discipline review;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COMMON COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF GREENWOOD, INDIANA, AS FOLLOWS

<u>Section 1.</u> Greenwood Municipal Code (1993), as amended, Chapter 6, Article 15. Fire Department Merit System, is hereby amended as follows:

- A. In Sec. 6-462, Discipline by the Commission; Appeal, by inserting the following additional subsection (h), to read as follows:
  - "(h) Ex Parte Communication. A Commissioner shall not initiate, participate in, or consider ex parte communication concerning any pending disciplinary matter or other matters about which charges are expected. Ex parte communication includes any communication with a Commissioner by a party, representative of a party, or a person acting on behalf of a party without the presence of the adverse party. The term does not include the formal written submissions submitted to the Commission (and served upon opposing parties) and testimony and evidence presented at the hearing. Commissioner who is exposed to ex parte communication (or attempts) shall immediately inform other Commissioners and the adverse party. A commissioner who has received ex parte information may be excluded from any participation in the subject matter of the ex parte communication upon motion of either party and majority vote of the remaining Commissioners. A Commissioner's failure to disclose ex parte communication (including attempts which he or she rebuffs) may subject the Commissioner to removal from the Commission pursuant to I.C., 36-8-3.5-7. A member who participates in ex parte communication or attempts at ex parte communication shall be subject to discipline up to termination. Nothing in this subsection shall be construed to prevent the Chief's delegate from communicating with the Commission pursuant to Indiana Code or Greenwood ordinances.
- B. In Sec. 6-463, Summary Discipline by the Chief; Review, by inserting the following additional subsection (d), to read as follows:
  - "(d) Ex Parte Communication. A Commissioner shall not initiate, participate in, or consider *ex parte* communication concerning any pending disciplinary matter or other matters about which charges are expected. *Ex parte* communication includes any communication with a Commissioner by a party, representative of a party, or a person acting on behalf of a party without the presence of the adverse party. The term does not include the formal written submissions submitted to the Commission (and served upon opposing parties) and testimony and evidence presented at the hearing. A Commissioner who is exposed to *ex parte* communication (or attempts) shall immediately inform other Commissioners and the adverse party. A commissioner who

has received *ex parte* information may be excluded from any participation in the subject matter of the *ex parte* communication upon motion of either party and majority vote of the remaining Commissioners. A Commissioner's failure to disclose *ex parte* communication (including attempts which he or she rebuffs) may subject the Commissioner to removal from the Commission pursuant to *I.C.*, 36-8-3.5-7. A member who participates in *ex parte* communication or attempts at *ex parte* communication shall be subject to discipline up to termination. Nothing in this subsection shall be construed to prevent the Chief or the Chief's delegate from communicating with the Commission pursuant to Indiana Code or Greenwood ordinances.

Section 2. All other provisions of Greenwood Municipal Code (1993), as amended, Chapter 6, Article 15. Fire Department Merit System, as amended, not specifically referenced herein shall remain unchanged.

Section 3. The sections, paragraphs, sentences, clauses, phrases and words of this ordinance are separable, and if any word, phrase, clause, sentence, paragraph or section of this ordinance shall be declared unconstitutional, invalid or unenforceable by the valid judgment or decree of a court of competent jurisdiction, such unconstitutionality, invalidity or unenforceability shall not affect any of the remaining words, phrases, clauses, sentences, paragraphs and sections of this ordinance.
