ORDINANCE NO. 24-38

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING THE 2024 SALARY ORDINANCE, COMMON COUNCIL ORDINANCE NO. 23-33, AND THE 2025 SALARY ORDINANCE, COMMON COUNCIL ORDINANCE NO. 24-27, TO INCREASE THE NUMBER OF DEPUTY FIRE MARSHAL POSITIONS IN THE FIRE DEPARTMENT

WHEREAS, the Greenwood Common Council passed Ordinance 23-33, "An Ordinance Fixing Salaries of Appointed Officers and Employees of the City of Greenwood, Indiana and City Utilities for the Year 2024" (the "2024 Salary Ordinance"), and Ordinance 24-27, "An Ordinance Fixing Salaries of Appointed Officers and Employees of the City of Greenwood, Indiana and City Utilities for the Year 2025" (the "2025 Salary Ordinance"), setting 2024 and 2025 salaries for all employees and stating whether each position is exempt or non-exempt;

WHEREAS, there is currently one (1) full-time Deputy Fire Marshal position in the Fire Department, and the Fire Chief requests the addition of one additional full-time Deputy Fire Marshal position to provide for flexibility in staffing;

WHEREAS, the 2024 Salary Ordinance and 2025 Salary Ordinance require amendment to increase the number of Deputy Fire Marshal positions in the Fire Department from one (1) to two (2);

WHEREAS, there exist unobligated funds currently in the Fire Department salary budget and there will be funds in the 2025 Fire Department salary budget to compensate the additional Deputy Fire Marshal position, and no additional appropriation is necessary to fund the amendments;

WHEREAS, the Deputy Fire Marshal position is a non-exempt position eligible for overtime compensation under the Municipal Code,

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COMMON COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF GREENWOOD, INDIANA, AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. The 2024 Salary Ordinance, Common Council Ordinance No. 23-33, Section 2, Fire, is hereby amended to increase the number of Deputy Fire Marshal positions in the Fire Department from one (1) to two (2), as follows:

Section 2. The 2025 Salary Ordinance, Common Council Ordinance No. 24-27, Section 2, Fire, is hereby amended to increase the number of Deputy Fire Marshal positions in the Fire Department from one (1) to two (2), as follows:

Section 3. This Ordinance shall have no effect upon any other provisions of Ordinance No. 23-33 and Ordinance No. 24-27 except as herein provided, and all other sections of Ordinance No. 23-33 and Ordinance No. 24-27 not inconsistent herewith shall remain the same.

Section 4. The sections, paragraphs, sentences, clauses, phrases and words of this Ordinance are separable, and if any word, phrase, clause, sentence, paragraph or section of this Ordinance shall be declared unconstitutional, invalid or unenforceable by the valid judgment or

this Ordinance.
Section 5. This Ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage, approval and publication according to law.
