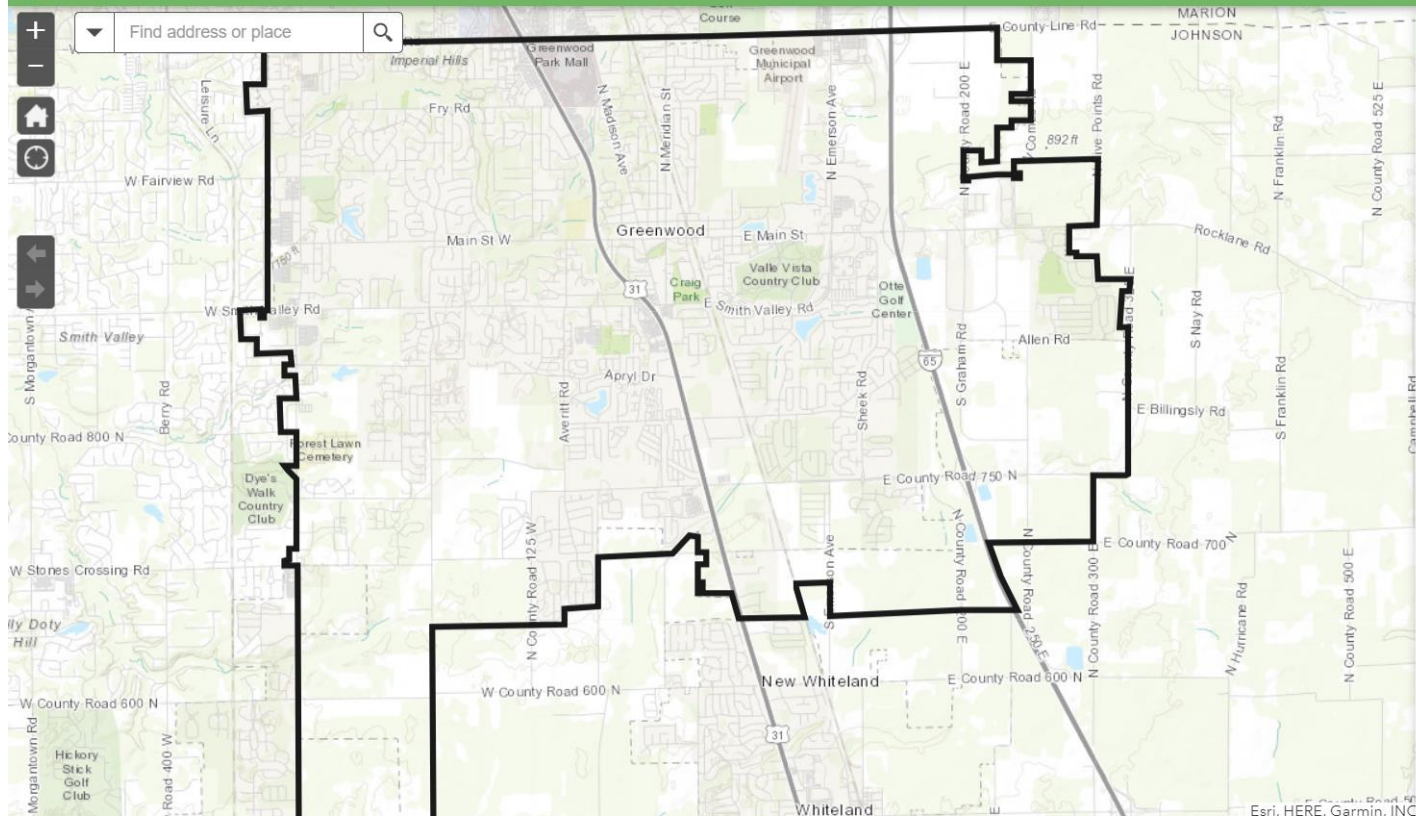

Sanitary Sewer and Waste Management

Greenwood's sanitary sewer system maintains 400 miles of existing pipe serving in northern Johnson County.

Waste management, currently partnering with [Best Way Disposal](#), provides trash, recycling, and leaf and limb pickup to more than 15,000 customers inside the corporate city limits of Greenwood.

Stormwater

Greenwood's stormwater system manages the runoff from rainfall. In nature, water flows from fields to streams to rivers and other waterways, but development impacted these natural flows. The stormwater system helps to prevent flooding and limits pollutants from flowing into streams and rivers.

Stormwater bills are sent to property owners quarterly (4 times per year).

Chinkapin Oak

(*Quercus muehlenbergii*)

The Chinkapin or Chinquapin Oak is a deciduous tree in the white oak group. A mature tree will reach about 70 feet with a 30 foot canopy. It can take up to 30 years to produce a substantial crop of small acorns that are the food of choice for many animals. The chinkapin oak prefers rich land with a high water table.

Leaves



The leaves are yellow-green and oval to elliptical. The leaf edge is toothed and slightly incurved. They resemble chestnut leaves and flutter in the breeze.

Fruit



The chinkapin produces small acorns 3/4 to 1 inch with a thin, bowl-shaped, warty cap covering half of the nut. Ripe fruit is dark brown to black.

Tree Benefits

Trees have the ability to lock up CO2 in their roots, trunks, stems, and leaves and even in wood products after they are harvested. This means atmospheric carbon generated by things like cars and airplanes can be reduced by trees.

Atmospheric carbon reduced by this tree:
15 pounds per year

Did you Know?

Early pioneers used the straight wood of the chinkapin oak to make thousands of miles of fences in Indiana, Kentucky and Ohio. The wood was also used for railroad ties when new railroads were crisscrossing the Midwest. The trees were also used to fuel steamships that ran on the Ohio river.







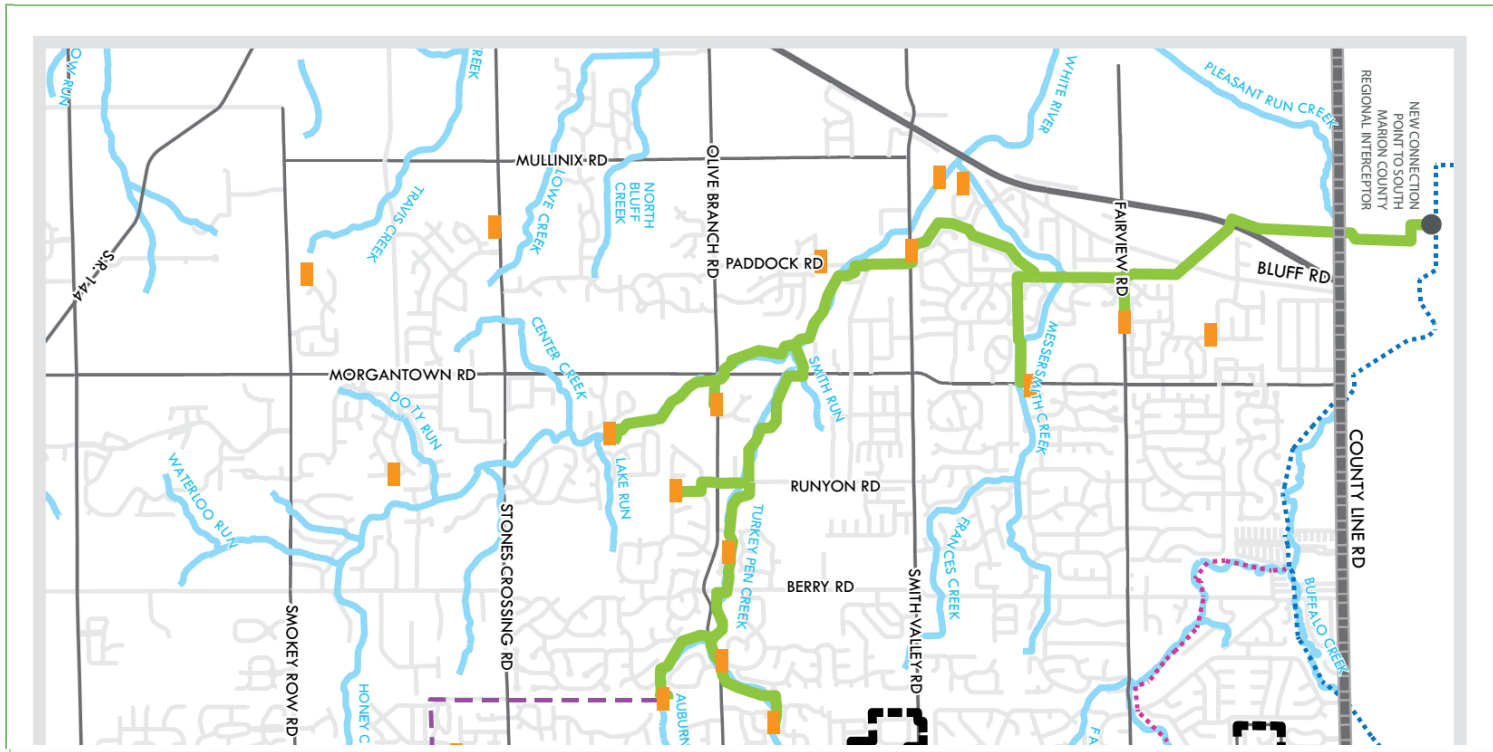

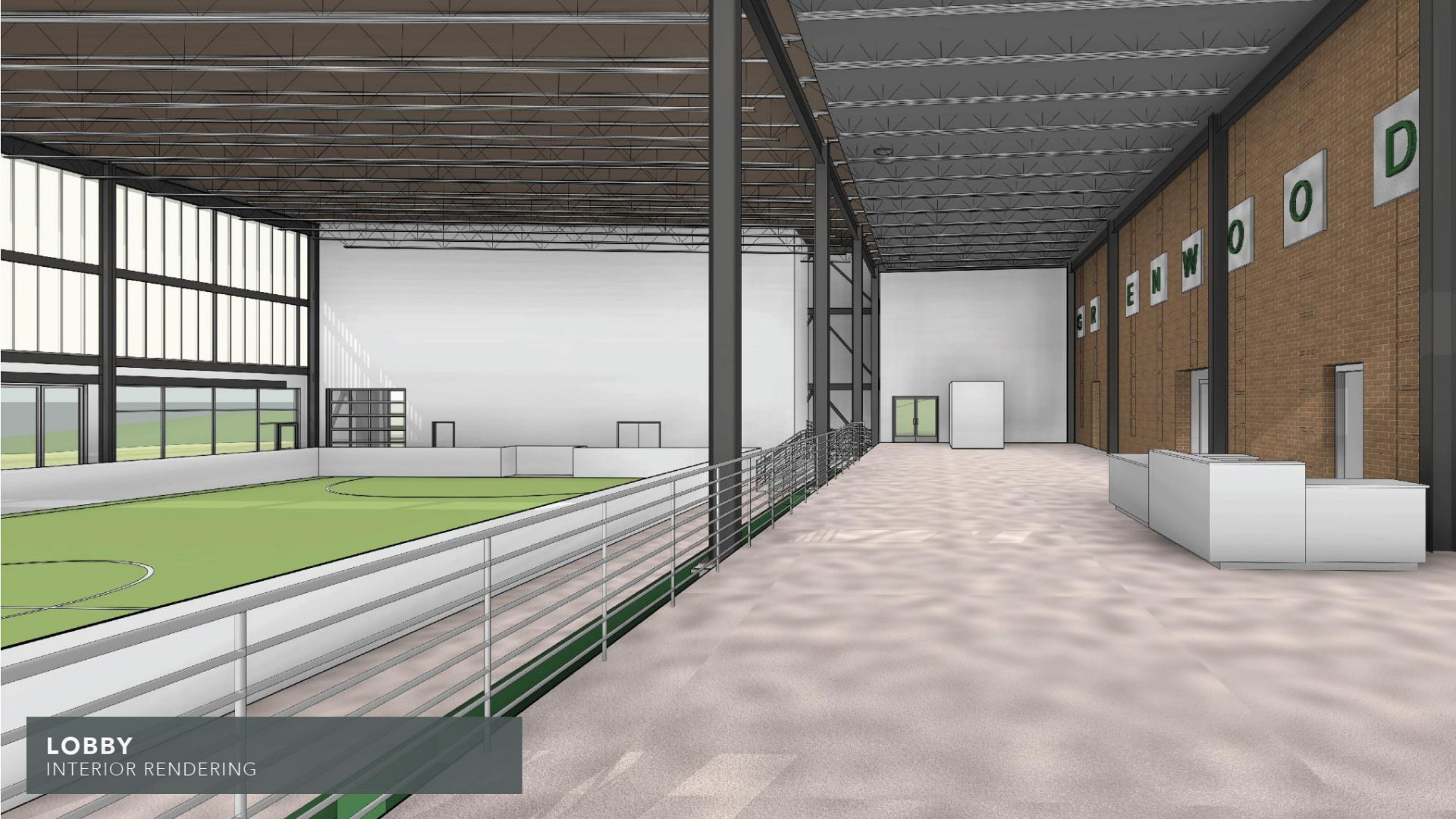

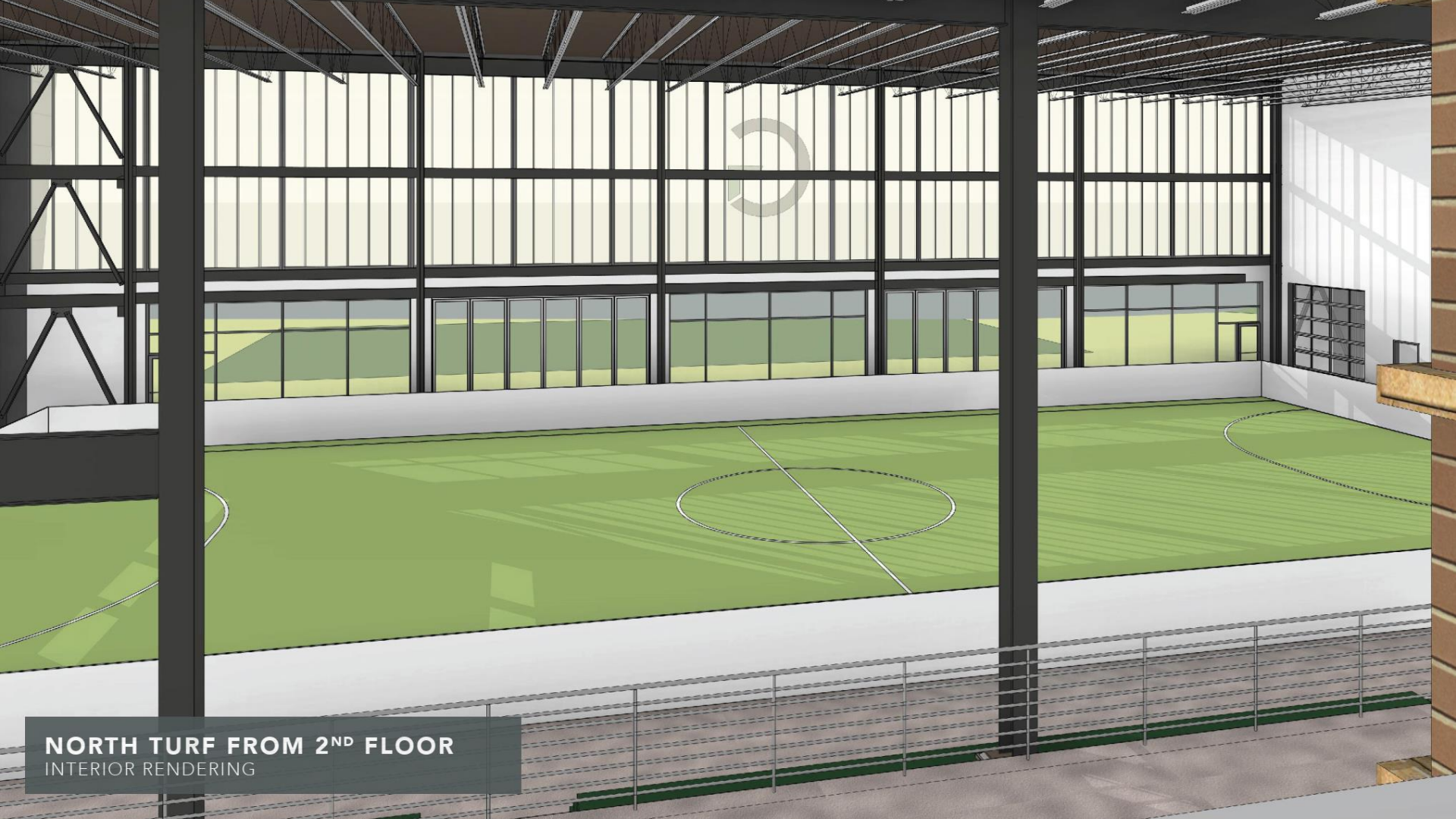
