Proposed Third Amendment to the 2019 Action Plan

Greenwoods 2019-2023 Consolidated Plan details the funding strategy for the Community Development Block Grant (CDBG), for the period between October 1, 2019 and September 30, 2024. The program year (PY) 2019 (FY 2019/20) Action Plan outlines the implementation of 2019 funding for the period between October 1, 2019 and September 30, 2020, which is developed through significant public input, analyses, and planning.

The City's Citizen Participation Plan (CPP) describes the efforts that the County will take to encourage its residents to participate in developing these plans. It also provides requirements for public process when a "substantial amendment" to the Action Plan is proposed. The following changes constitute a substantial amendment and require public notice as described in the CPP:

changes in funding that is more than 15% of the total annual grant award

However, due to COVID-19, the United States Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD) has issued guidance that that waives the Citizen Participation Plan requirements for entitlement recipients, provided that (1) no fewer than five days are provided for public comment and that (2) reasonable notice and the opportunity to comment is provided.

HUD has awarded additional supplemental funding through the Coronavirus Aid, Relief, and Economic Security Act (CARES Act) that requires programming in the PY 2019 Action Plan. The City of Greenwood would like to post a second substantial amendment to its PY

2019 Action Plan to reflect the additional funds and projects selected for funding. As such the following changes **(bolded)** shall be made to the PY 2019 Action Plan:
