Proposed First Amendment to the 2021 Action Plan

Greenwoods 2019-2023 Consolidated Plan details the funding strategy for the Community Development Block Grant (CDBG), for the period between October 1, 2019, and September 30, 2024. The program year (PY) 2021 (FY 2021/2022) Action Plan outlines the implementation of 2021 funding for the period between October 1, 2021, and September 30, 2021, which is developed through significant public input, analyses, and planning.

The City of Greenwood allocated an amount of funding based on estimates for installing a park trail at Northeast Park. Due to rising construction costs and the rising cost of oil, the City of Greenwood will need to allocate more funding towards that project. The City of Greenwood has unused resources from the 2019 Administration Project (\$96.70), the 2020 Administration Project (\$71,768), and the 2021 Johnson County Employer Resource Network (\$10,000) to allocate. The City of Greenwood would like to propose a first substantial amendment to its PY 2021 Action Plan to reflect the additional funds and increased project cost for the park trail at Northeast Park. As such the following changes (bolded) shall be made to the PY 2021 Action Plan:

1: Expected Resources

Current Plan:

In PY2021, the City of Greenwood will receive \$329,172 of CDBG funding. The funding will be used primarily to continue improvements in the Northeast Park. Some of the funding will be used to pilot new programs in Greenwood, providing general supportive services to low to moderate income households.
