RESOLUTION NO. 24-16

A RESOLUTION OF THE GREENWOOD COMMON COUNCIL AUTHORIZING THE FILING OF AN APPLICATION FOR, THE ACCEPTANCE OF, AND IMPLEMENTATION OF, AN EDWARD BYRNE JUSTICE ASSISTANCE GRANT IN THE AMOUNT OF \$20,008.00 WITH THE U.S. DEPARTMENT OF JUSTICE AND RELATED MATTERS (FUNDING FOR PURCHASE OF EQUIPMENT)

WHEREAS, The Indiana Criminal Justice Institute (ICJI) is now accepting applications for the 2025 Edward Byrne Memorial Justice Assistance Grant, which is the primary provider of federal criminal justice funding to state and local jurisdictions;

WHEREAS, the City of Greenwood Police Department desires to apply for grant funds to purchase law enforcement related equipment for the Police Department through the Edward Byrne Justice Assistance Grant (JAG Grant) Program for Fiscal Year 2025 from the U.S. Department of Justice and applied for such Grant through the ICJI;

WHEREAS, the City of Greenwood may receive grant funds in the amount of Twenty Thousand Eight Dollars and 00/100 (\$20,008.00) for the purchase of law enforcement related equipment to improve officer safety and efficiency, as well as improve public service;

WHEREAS, the City of Greenwood Police Department intends to use the JAG Grant funds toward the purchase of unfunded equipment as deemed necessary from time to time in fiscal year 2025;

WHEREAS, the City must certify that it will not use the Federal funds to replace or supplant State or Local funds that would be made available for the purchase of law enforcement related equipment;

WHEREAS, the City of Greenwood shall apply for the JAG Grant to receive the funds for purchase of law enforcement related equipment and the City of Greenwood Police Department is the fiscal agent and is responsible for applying for and administering the JAG Grant;

WHEREAS, the City of Greenwood desires to apply for the Department of Justice JAG Grant for Fiscal Year 2025 and to authorize the acceptance and implementation of the JAG Grant as now contemplated for the purchase of equipment for the Police Department to improve officer safety and efficiency; and

WHEREAS, it is required that the City of Greenwood enter into various contracts and agreements and authorize the execution and filing of said JAG Grant application and supporting documents that are necessary or convenient for the receipt of said JAG Grant funds if said terms and conditions are satisfied.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE GREENWOOD COMMON COUNCIL AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. The City of Greenwood, Indiana, hereby authorizes the filing of an application for, and acceptance and implementation of, a Department of Justice JAG Grant for Fiscal year 2025, further authorizes all other convenient or necessary agreements and documents related to acceptance, implementation and administration of said JAG Grant, and that such funds received from the Grant will not use the Federal funds to replace or supplant State or Local funds that would be made available for the purchase of law enforcement related equipment.


Section 2. Mark Myers, Mayor of the City of Greenwood, Indiana, and/or James Ison, Chief of Police of the Greenwood Police Department, are hereby empowered and authorized to act and execute on behalf of the City, any and all convenient or necessary contracts, agreements, and documents required in the obtaining and expenditure of said JAG Grant funds.

Section 3. All actions heretofore taken in furtherance of the filing of the JAG Grant application are hereby ratified.

Section 4. The sections, paragraphs, sentences, clauses, phrases and words of this Resolution are separable, and if any word, phrases clauses sentence paragraph or section of this Resolution shall be declared unconstitutional, invalid or unenforceable by the valid judgment of decree of a court of competent jurisdiction, such unconstitutionality, invalidity or unenforceability shall not affect any of the remaining words, phrases, clauses, sentences, paragraphs and sections of this Resolution.

Section 5. The Resolution shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage and approval by the Mayor of the City of Greenwood, Indiana.


